


her to us late last year, We look forward to working with her and the possibility of new fresh ideas from a perspective of younger person.

Donate to Our Collection




It is always a treat when a present or former Greece resident contacts the Greece Historical Society to share their family history with us. Earlier this year, Ken Wehner made an appointment to bring in his family's photo albums so that we might make copies to add to our collection. Ken, who was born in Greece, now lives in Albany and had come to town to attend the funeral of beloved and long-time Section V Hall of Fame Coach Ed Nietopski, who died at the age of 95 in March 2023.

Ken's albums contained a wealth of information on George and Jane McGuire Wehner, their six children and grandchildren. I scanned about 100 photos while Ken was attending the calling hours and then marked the additional pix that we wanted to copy. Ken was kind enough to scan and send them to us via e-mail once he got back home to Albany.

Another branch of the **Ignatz Wehner** family was covered in our first pioneer book. Thanks to Ken, we now have his branch preserved for future generations.



Pioneer Families of the Town of Greece Volume 2

Our long-anticipated book *Pioneer Families of the Town of Greece Volume 2* will be published later this spring. The project has been a labor of love for authors **Marie Poinan** and **Jo Ann Ward Snyder** but has proven to be much more difficult and time consuming than Volume 1. If you are waiting for the book, please be patient, the book WILL be available soon.



Hidden in Plain Sight

In the December Corinthian, **Jo Ann Ward Snyder** wrote a story about **J.P. Fetzner** and his wine making business on Long Pond Road in the late 1800s. Illustrated in the article was a photograph of a J.P. Fetzner wine jug that we recently acquired because of its rarity and importance to our town's history.

For the past three years our museum has had a prohibition exhibit. As part of the exhibit our volunteers constructed a model still (see arrow) that helped to illustrate a homemade distilling process.

In late December, while dismantling the exhibit in preparation for our new baseball exhibit, the jug was turned around and to our surprise J. P. Fetzner name was clearly marked on it. Apparently when the exhibit was put together, someone used an old jug they found in our attic but never looked at the name on it. We now are in possession of two very rare J. P. Fetzner wine jugs and because of Jo Ann's research, we now know their story.
